Nano Nagle No Frontiers

We are blessed in Colaiste Nano Nagle to have a truly multicultural community! Every day we are enriched by traditions and ways of thinking from every corner of the globe. This is indeed what our Foundress, Nano Nagle, would have wanted for any school that bears her name. She expressed the wish that her care and that of her followers would extend beyond Ireland's shores. Presentation Sisters do in fact work in many countries and now we have a rainbow of nationalities receiving that same care and the best of education here in the heart of Limerick.

I have been fortunate to bring a little of that same spirit of Nano Nagle to South-East Asia over the past fourteen months. Of course anything I brought was more than repaid in the ways I was enriched by my experiences with the people of those countries. I spent most of my time in a country called Myanmar (or Burma). Many of you will be newly aware of the suffering of so many in that country in recent months due to conflict and an exodus of refugees. It is true that Myanmar has many problems yet to overcome. But it has also come a long way in recent years. I had the good fortune to teach young people on various programmes, from leadership training to vocational skills to English language classes for young women aiming to enter religious life. In all cases, the thirst of these young people for learning was hugely impressive as was their intelligence and enthusiasm in reaching for their goals. Fondacio (a movement involved in youth and development programmes among others), the Good Shepherd Sisters and the local Catholic Church were powerful agents for good and I was delighted to work with them. I do have hope for Myanmar. I think that education will be paramount in realizing this hope.

I also spent periods recently in Vietnam and the Philippines where I likewise witnessed a tremendous work ethic and the determination to improve the lives of everyone, particularly the poor. Once more, young people were very active, especially those who generously wanted to live out their Christian faith in serving struggling communities where they lived.

The world has rightly been called a global village. We can never forget this in Colaiste Nano Nagle. We continue to remember our sisters and brothers from every nation through our classes and activities from debating world issues to intercultural days.
